SOCIAL ORGANISER'S REPORT

SCCQ State Meet - Concours. Brett reported that on Saturday 21st August 2021, the Studebaker Car club of Queensland held our Annual State Meet including Concours judging for original vehicles and a Show and Shine class for members not wishing to participate in the Concours.

The event was held at Old Petrie Town, an historical village located Northwest of Brisbane City. The event covered 3 days of activity with early birds evening on Friday, Saturday display day and a run to country pub at Linville.

30 Cars attended the event on the day with another couple of members dropping in through the Saturday to check out the cars on the day.

Weather was quite warm and sunny, reaching mid 20's on the day, perfect as always in Queensland, between the Seasons. Members enjoyed the day catching up after the challenging preceding 18 months. It was great to see everyone out and about again.

The Sunday Run left Old Petrie Town between 9:30 and 10am travelling through Mt Mee, Dayboro, Woodford, Kilcoy and Moore concluding at the Linville Hotel for lunch. It was a pleasant drive through some picturesque countryside.

Brett added that a representative from Hot Rod Magazine showed considerable interest in the Champ Utility of Dave Lucas. With Dave's assistance, Brett subsequently submitted an article to the Magazine for future publication.

On behalf of all Club members, Bill thanked Brett for all his hard work in organising a weekend that was an outstanding success. Bill also thanked the members who acted as Judges on the day and George for his photographic record.

Drive Your Studebaker Day, Sept 11. Brett advised that members participated in two runs: South to Espresso Twenty5 Café, 1 Boatworks Drive, Coomera; and, North to Sea Salt & Vine, Reef Point Esplanade, Scarborough.

State Meet 2022. Bill reported that an initial suggestion of South Bank Parklands had been rejected due to the considerable site fees required.

WEB EDITOR REPORT

George advised that everything was up to date with the Web Site with photos of the State Meet being added; and, the Membership Application Form amended to reflect current committee details.

GENERAL BUSINESS

Tool Pool. Bill advised that an email had been sent to members to gauge interest and to ascertain what tools/equipment they would be prepared to loan to fellow members. Two responses had been received to date.

Name Badges. After a general discussion the need for more name badges was confirmed. Brett volunteered to source information on the previous supplier.

Special Interest Scheme Registration. Bill highlighted the following changes to Scheme which he had received via the Queensland Historic Motoring Council:

“SIVS Matters (Special Interest Vehicle Scheme) The biggest change commenced on 1 September with the new Regulation which provides for SIVS registration.

The SIVS Guidelines include conditions issued under that Regulation. Previously, it was only necessary to belong to an Incorporated Vehicle Club (or Association) to obtain SIVS registration for the first time, but there was no legal obligation to remain a member thereafter. Clubs were often frustrated by people joining to access SIVS, but then never renewing.

From now on, it is a condition of SIVS registration that the vehicle operator must belong to an Incorporated Vehicle Club. There are 2 new provisions to note: (i) The SIVS Concession Registration must be removed if the registered operator is no longer a current member of an incorporated car club or association, and 1 (ii) Use of the vehicle while not a member (or in contravention of any other SIVS restriction eg driving to and from work) now carries a penalty of up to **\$2757** for vehicles up to 4.5 tonnes and **\$8271** for heavier vehicles.”

Bill reiterated that it is the responsibility of each member using SIS Registration to familiarize themselves with the Qld Govt guidelines at <https://www.qld.gov.au/transport/registration/fees/concession/special-interest>

Upcoming Runs/Events:

Brett advised that a number of runs were under consideration and would be finalised in coming weeks.

Video – State Meet. Brett presented a video of the State Meet that had been produced by his son, Blake. As with a similar video that Blake created in 2019, this production was just as professional and provided an excellent record of the venue, the judging morning, the vehicles on display and the informal conversations amongst members. Well done Blake!

MEETING CLOSURE

There being no further business Bill thanked everyone for attending and closed the meeting at 8.10pm.
