## MEMBER ITEM OF INTEREST

Ross Oldman gave an enthusiastic and informative account of his earlier life as a Shotfirer in Papua New Guinea.

Originally from New Zealand, Ross sought his fortune in the WA mining industry, specifically mining for bauxite with Alcoa, before moving to Papua New Guinea with BHP.

Ross had accepted the position of Drill and Blast Manager at the joint venture Ok Tedi Mine. As well as coming to grips with an entirely new aspect of mining, Ross had responsibility for recruiting and training drill and blast crews from the local population.

Ross described the adverse impacts that the local rain fall (approx. 11.5 m/yr.) had upon mining operations; in particular, keeping explosives dry and operating heavy equipment in dangerous conditions. Ross recalled one occasion where he had to scale the 23m high drill rig to perform expedient repairs, necessary to keep operations going.

As Ross' work primarily involved explosives, it wasn't surprising that a couple of his anecdotes involved sheltering form falling rocks either under vehicles or behind large bulldozer blades!

Despite cultural differences and issues, Ross' fondest memory of his time at Ok Tedi was the relationships he built with his local drill and blast crews. Relationships founded on mutual dignity and respect. Thank you, Ross for an excellent presentation.

For the September monthly meeting Gus Trouchet will be giving a presentation on his exploits as a boat builder and sailor that also involved time spent in Papua New Guinea.
